LOGLINE

When the wealthy elite of humanity flee Earth, they doom the billions left behind—but a clan of warriors survives on Earth, and 100 years later, they send one woman to avenge the most horrific crime in their history: **TEMEO**.

SYNOPSIS

A century after the GREAT DEMISE, which saw the removal of 99% of human life on Earth, Temeo is chosen by her grandfather, the Daimyo Tengoku leyasu (The Lord of Heaven and Earth) to avenge the EXILES' great crime: abandoning humanity in a time of crisis, and refusing to share the fruits of the new worlds they have discovered. Now in the 23rd Century A.D. in Central Asia, Temeo must learn how to defeat her enemy and do what is necessary to save her people—even if that means facing down her own family. At a time when the Moon moves backward in the sky, the stakes are nothing less than the end of the world as we know it.

SUPPORTING CHARACTERS

TENGOKU IEYASU ("YASU"), the warlord, patriarch, and ruler of Earth; TEMEO's grandfather, and ultimately the antagonist of Season I.

JIN HANBEI, the frontline general and favored son of Yasu; he is TEMEO's teacher and commander in the field.

JIN PI, the only son of HANBEI; he is TEMEO's fellow student and foil that is sometimes romantic, sometimes rival.

SHUI, the witch controlling the moon; TEMEO's mother, and Season I's first major enemy.

THE BEARS, a barbarian horde attacking Tengoku lands, which TEMEO must help the Jin family defend.

THE EXILES, the men of the powerful kingdoms from faraway planets, who return to Earth, ostensibly as the main antagonists.



PILOT EPISODE

WHO? | TEMEO is sent by YASU to meet HANBEI. She is supposed to learn the practical science of war, and how to command armies, if she is to rule her own planet one day. Nara, Hanbei's deputy and confidante, is waiting for her, when she arrives months late.

WHERE? | HANBEI is waiting for her at a camp on the Amu Darya River. NARA intercepts TEMEO at the ruins of Bukhara, where his own men are camped; he guides her to HANBEI's location, but not before showing her ruins from the GREAT DEMISE.

WHEN? | TEMEO has recently turned 18 years old; 99 years have passed since the GREAT DEMISE and the Exile that followed. NARA explains the history of the GREAT DEMISE to TEMEO, in a flashback, before they proceed on to HANBEI, and later, the battle with the BEARS.

WHY? | TEMEO must learn war firsthand from a talented field commander. HANBEl is that man; she is accepted into his company, and then is part of a night raid on an enemy camp. She disobeys orders, is wounded, and barely escaped on horseback from dozens of enemy machine guns and bear-riders.





SEASON I ROADMAP

RISING ACTION

Yasu's other sons die in India, leaving only Hanbei; they step up the training of Pi and Temeo, who become very powerful. Yasu decides to separate them; he sends them on different missions, away from one another.



Pi takes a breather on the long walk home from the mountains where he fights Shui. Yasu meets him on the road, in disguise, to try to heal his spirit, especially since he knows there is more trouble ahead.

FIRST BATTLE

Temeo and Pi, as young warriors, fight alongside their mentor Hanbei in a battle against the bears, on a small village alongside the Amu Darya. High action and focus on lore and the core family (Temeo/Pi/Yasu/Hanbei).



Pi fights in an epic battle against Temeo's mother Shui, who he assumes is Temeo herself. It is a dramatic reveal; Pi regretfully kills Shui at the end.

Meanwhile, Temeo fights alongside Hanbei, but in a recurring theme, bites off more than she can chew, disobeys orders, and has a falling out with Hanbei. She is then sent, in a surprise, back home for a wedding... her wedding.

WEDDING FINALE

Temeo clashes with Pi and Yasu when they try to convince her to marry an Exile prince. She agrees, but now resents her family and feels like she has been abandoned. It is an arranged marriage and Temeo doesn't know her new Exile husband, Vincent.

The afterparty is interrupted when a rider announces Hanbei's death. Temeo and Pi try to leave together. Yasu tells them to stop; they refuse, so he kills Temeo's horse in the climatic moment of the season. Pi abandons Temeo; she faces Yasu alone, in a mental battle that she loses. She ultimately takes Auntie Jing's advice to survive, and leave with the Exiles, rather than be murdered by her grandfather Yasu, the real enemy all along.



WORLDS & THEMES

THE ELEVEN WORLDS | The events of the first four seasons of *Ocean Black* set off all kinds of consequences, events, and stories in the larger universe. There are many planets and climates and peoples to experiment with, and opportunities to bring in different guest voices and languages, for a diverse but unique and futuristic realism.

COLUMBIA THE WEBSPINNER | Part of TEMEO's story is her belief in her own divinity, linked to a story of her alleged goddess of a great-grandmother, COLUMBIA. One of TEMEO's recurring themes, and challenges, is living up to her own image of herself, as a divine descendant of a goddess, destined for something bigger than any normal person.

OCEAN BLACK BOOKS | The story of TEMEO comes from the lore for the original *Ocean Black* novels by E.J.Wedge. These have been recently released with new cover art, featuring the artists from the show. Themes from the books include:

- the innate goodness of all people, despite their bad choices;
- the difference in experiences and expectations for men and women, as they come of age, and wield power;
- the importance of truthful faiths, not powerful priests;
- the question of whether anyone, even a demigod like Temeo, can rule absolutely but justly;
- and the futility of war, and how no man or woman can ever kill their way to peace.
